CCTV update our CCTV system has been upgraded to enhance security around our school. New cameras have been strategically placed to monitor common areas, entrances, and the playground, ensuring a comprehensive view of the school grounds and helping to deter unauthorized visitors. We want to reassure you that the privacy of our students, staff, and parents remains a top priority. Access to the footage is strictly controlled. We believe these improvements will significantly strengthen the safety of our school environment. Whatsapp As technology becomes increasingly integrated into our children's lives, it's important to address the challenges associated with messaging apps like WhatsApp. While these platforms facilitate communication, they

can also expose children to risks such as cyberbullying, inappropriate content, and privacy concerns. Please remember that the minimum age to use WhatsApp is 13. As parents, it's our responsibility to monitor and guide our children's usage of these apps. We understand that the decision to allow app usage is ultimately yours, but these age restrictions are designed to protect our children.




We've noticed a concerning trend with Year 6 pupils using WhatsApp inappropriately, which can sometimes lead to bullying and inappropriate use of phones. Therefore we are reconsidering our rules around children in all year groups bringing phones to school and will be writing to you in the near future to make our expectations of pupils clear.

We strongly encourage you to have open conversations about online safety, set clear boundaries, and regularly check in on your child's phone and app usage. By supervising children's technology use, we can help them develop healthy habits, protect them from potential dangers and teach them to be kind. 

We'd like to celebrate World Book Day by inviting everyone to dress as a favourite character from a favourite book. This could be a full costume or could be an accessory or two to represent the character.






PTFA Pancakes & Plea

Safety and parking around school.

With nearly 700 students arriving at our school each day, traffic can be quite challenging. While we've been fortunate not to have had any serious accidents, we want to ensure it stays that way. It's important for everyone to be vigilant and cautious around the school, especially since young children can suddenly appear.

Please remember to keep your speed to a minimum in the vicinity of the school. On Ashfield Road, do not stop or park in the turning circle at any time, as this can obstruct traffic. Additionally, on Upper Drove, we kindly ask that you refrain from parking in the bus area or using the staff car park as a turning space. When buses are not present, this area serves as an important passing space to keep traffic moving during busy times. Parents/Carers are not permitted to use the carpark as a pick up or drop off point.

Also, please avoid parking in areas marked with yellow cones or on double yellow lines, and be respectful of our neighbors by not blocking driveways.

If possible, consider walking to school. If walking isn't feasible, think about parking a short distance away and walking the last part of the journey. By working together, we can help prevent accidents and ensure everyone's safety.
